sargent cypress (Cupressus sargentii)



Round cones with rounded without conspicuous resin glands

► Above the marine layer on Red Mountain



(Cupressaceae)

Bark: greysih-brown to black, thick, fiberous Needles: dull green sometimes waxy without resin glands Cones: spherical, 2-3 cm long, greyish-brown, 2-5 scales Habitat: serpentine scrubland, pine-oak, and mixed conifer forest Range: Most widely districuted cypress in California, northern range extension on Red Mountain in Mendocino County

MacNab cypress (Cupressus macnabiana)

(Cupressaceae)




Round cones with distinct upcurved umbos and conspicuous resinous abaxial glands similar to C. bakeri

▶Furrowed, fiberous bark



Bark: grey, fiberous, peeling Needles: greyish-green with waxy resin dots Cones: spherical, 2.5-3.5 cm long, greyish-brown, 3-4 scales, upcurved umbo at tip Habitat: Serpentine scrubland, open pine-oak Range: historically recorded in Klamath Mountains now extirpated, nearby in Tehama County

Gowen cypress (Cupressus goveniana var. pigmaea)

Bark: gray-brown to reddish-brown, fiberous and furrowed Needles: yellow-green to dark-green, rounded brachlets, scale-like Cones: greyish-brown, 2-3 cm long, 3-5 scales, flat umbo at maturity **Habitat**: coastal closed-cone pine forests on sterile, hardpan,

acidic soils Range: in Northwest California Mendocino and Sonoma Counties
