ghost pine

Pinaceae Pinus sabiniana



- ▼ the bluish-grey tree shimmers like a ghost out of the hot, dry chaparral



Bark: dark grey on the ridges, flaky and black underneath when young, growing more solid with age; deeply furrowed in between the ridges and reddish brown in the furrows Needles: 3 to a bundle and long (up to 12"), grayish-green in color Cones: up to 10", symmetrical, big, nasty, and yet beautiful, very similar to those of Coulter pine, with large pointed hooks at the tips of the scales; weighs up to 2 pounds Habitat: hot, lower elevation foothills and river valleys, mixed with chaparral
